- 8 are natives of 5 countries in Asia
- 5 are natives of 2 countries in Australlia And The Pacific Islands
- 2 are natives of 1 country in Africa

These Fellows will accomplish their advanced study as follows:

- 74 in 14 countries of Europe
- 44 in 3 countries of North America
- 4 in 3 countries of South America
- 3 in 2 countries of Asia
- 3 in Australlia
- 1 in Africa
