

#### DR. RONALD E. McNAIR

Dr. Ronald E. McNair, astronaut and distinguished scientist, is being honored today as an outstanding and most celebrated citizen of Lake City, South Carolina, as well as being a courageous American.

A native of Lake City, South Carolina, Ronald will be remembered as an important member of NASA's space shuttle mission ST-11 aboard the Challenger. He was involved in a number of new scientific experiments, and the documentation of the mission with special cameras.

Ronald graduated with the highest honor from Carver High School, Lake City, South Carolina in 1967. While at Carver High School, he was outstanding in sports, music, and held membership in the Honor Society, and the Science Club.

Ronald often recalled the foundation he received in the classrooms at Carver High School. "I had very good teachers there," he said. "I count my experiences at Carver as very important and positive ones. The Lake City school system was important to me in the way of total development. I am more of a complete person."

McNair earned a degree in physics at A&T State University, Greensboro, N.C. in 1971. After leaving A&T State University, he earned a Ph.D. degree in laser physics from the Massachusettes Institute of Technology and launched a career as a research scientist with the Hughes Laboratory in California. Shortly thereafter, he received in the mail a notice that the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) was seeking applicants for the U.S. Space Program. He submitted an application and became one of four blacks selected for the program out of the 11,000 applicants.

As a noted laser physicist, Ronald was involved in a number of internationally significant experiments. Those experiments have provided new understanding and applications for highly excited polyatomic molecules.

In 1975, Ronald studied laser physics with many authorities in the field of E' cole D'ete Theorique de Physique, Les Houches, France. He published several papers in the areas of lasers and molecular spectroscopy and gave many presentations in the United States and Europe.

Ronald received the following special honors: graduated magna cum laude from A&T State University, named a Presidential Scholar, A Ford Foundation Fellow, a National Fellowship Fund Fellow, a NATO Fellow, Omega Psi Phi Scholar of the Year Award, Los Angeles Public School System Service Commendation, Distinquished Alumni Award, National Society of Black Professional Engineers Distinquished National Scientist Award, Friends of Freedom Award, Outstanding Young Man of America, Who's Who Among Black Americans, An AAU Gold Medal, Five Regional Blackbelt Karate Championships, honorary doctorate of Laws from North Carolina A&T State University, honorary doctorate of Science from Morris College, Sumter, SC, honorary degree from the University of South Carolina, Columbia, SC, The Order of the Palmetto, South Carolina's highest honor, and other proclamations and awards.

Ronald was a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the American Optical Society, the American Physical Society (APS), the APS Committee on Minorities in Physics, the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics Board of Trustees, and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, and was a visiting lecturer in physics at Texas Southern University.

His family includes his wife Cheryl, and two children, Reginald and Joy Cheroy of Houston, Texas; his mother, Mrs. Pearl McNair of Lake City, SC; his father, Columbus McNair, and two brothers, Carl and Eric McNair, all of Atlanta, GA.
