

Wisconsin Member Writes 1st Moon Song

The first waltz number to dance to on the moon has been written by a member of the United Steelworkers of America. Title of the moon song is "Not Impossible Waltz on the Moon" composed by Sven M. Swanson of Local 1533, Beloit, Wis.

In a letter to STEEL LABOR, the Wisconsin unionist said, "... people begged me time and again to write something for the moon venture. I finally gave them this song ..."

Copies of the copyrighted music were given to the astronauts prior to the launching of their Apollo 11 space ship and to Pres. Nixon, Walter Cronkite and to Swedish King Gustav V. Mr. Swanson writes in his letter.
