
I am currently contacting as many of the speakers at the "Aerospace Medicine Spinoff Symposium" held in September 1971 at Long Beach, California as possible, to determine if they could suggest sources from which I could obtain information and/or demonstration hardware on medical techniques and equipment developed as a result of aerospace research.

We at NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center, are currently planning a Health and Medical Spinoff Exhibit. We hope to equipt a room and demonstrate as many medical benefits as possible to the general public. I have been assigned the task of preliminary investigation to determine hardware/information availability, sources for procurement, and costs (if possible) associated with obtaining actual hardware, mock-ups, models, photographs, etc.

I have obtained abstracts of the material presented at the "Aerospace Medicine Spinoff Symposium in which you participated. Many of the displays and discussions at the symposium appear to have exhibit merit.

Could you suggest items, sources, costs, etc. on aerospace medical spinoffs suitable for our needs? We are, of course, more interested in visual materials than written materials. Since my research is preliminary I cannot make commitments nor am I asking for commitments on your part. I am asking for information to present to the Space Benefits Exhibit Committee. All final decisions concerning the exhibit will be made by the committee. I would appreciate any suggestions you could make.
